The General Assembly is conducting the Redistricting of our Congressional Districts as they are legally bound to do every 10 years after the US Census. NC will be divided into

INFORMATION FOR CLUBS

If this is your club's election year, each club should be voting in November on their new officers for the next term. These officers should be installed in December. It is very important that the club president send the names and email addresses of the new officers to Pres. Kay Wildt ncfrepublianwomen@gmail.com as soon as possible.

November and December are the months for your membership drive for 2022. (You can no longer send in 2021 memberships) As you have your Christmas and holiday parties pass out the membership forms. The Assistant Treasurer will be collecting your club's membership list in January. Members who have not renewed by March 1, 2022, will be dropped from membership. Our Annual membership period is from January 1 - December 31.

Candidates will start filing for 2022 public offices in December. As soon as filing closes, the official primary period will begin until the primary election in March (hopefully) Remember our **clubs and club presidents** support all Republican candidates equally. Invite them to your meetings and give them a **generous** time to speak. Your club can have a tremendous influence in local elections. All regular members can attend fundraisers and support their favorite candidates.
