## The President's Corner

In retrospect, 2009 gave us all a bad case of “Future Shock.” The book *Future Shock* was written in 1965 by sociologist and futurist Alvin Toffler. Toffler defined Future Shock as “a personal perception of too much change in too short a period of time.” A quick study of today’s notable futurists, and of course history, indicates Americans are pushing back, and possibly returning to the good ole fashion common sense, that made this a great country to begin with.

There are some creepy similarities between the mood and conditions today and around 1940. The 20s, like the 90s, were a high flying time of excess and wealth creation, followed by a crash. Nothing came close to emulating the Great Depression, until the 2009 bust. An overconfident and at times out-of-touch and misguided Hoover, paved the way for Franklin Roosevelt and his “brain trust” – all avid students of communism. FDR came in with a heavy handed social agenda and the young Turks ready to apply what they had learned studying the USSR to America. The administration and Congress chose to downplay the growing conflict in Europe, until it came knocking on December 7, 1941 in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. Four days later, Hitler declared war on America. The “braintrusters,” who had a few years earlier waged war on the free market system and business, ranging from the Jewish, chicken butcher Schechter Brothers of New York City to utilities, suddenly began looking to American business to help win the war. We won, and entered halcyon days that would continue until the sexual revolution and the Vietnam War collided.

Futurists from Faith Popcorn to Gerald Celente are making predictions favorable to the deep desire we all hold for a return to balance. As a right-of-center country, we like the free market with all its potential for abuse and flaw; there’s still no better economic system. We still want to live in a representative republic.

- A trend toward “living local” creating a boom for farmer’s markets, community colleges, and hometown banks.
- A literal crash in 2010 as the rising equity markets, which bear the load for recovery claims, blow up because they won’t pass real world reality tests.
- More Fort Hood-like attacks as angry jihadists continue to seek revenge on American “infidels” (few frontiers remain after the underwear bomber).

### Introduction

Dr. Aldona Vos served as U.S. Ambassador to Estonia from 2004-2006. She is a native of Poland, the daughter of concentration camp survivor, Paul Zenon Vos, and recipient of Yad Vashem Righteous Among the Nations. Dr. Vos was appointed and subsequently reappointed by President Bush to serve on the United States Holocaust Memorial Council.



As Ambassador, she focused on winning the hearts and minds of the next generation of Estonian leaders, preventing AIDS, the preservation of the Estonian national culture and Russian integration. She received numerous awards for her dedication to the country and its citizens including the Order of the Cross of Terra Marina 1<sup>st</sup> class by the President of Estonia.

Dr. Vos earned her medical degree at Warsaw Medical Academy, completing her residency in Internal Medicine and fellowship in Pulmonary Medicine in New York City. She also holds a Doctor of Laws, honoris causa degree from the Institute of World Politics in Washington, DC and a Doctor of Humanities from Greensboro College in Greensboro, NC.

She has served on numerous boards including the United Way of Greater Greensboro, Family Services of the Piedmont, Hospice Palliative Care of Greensboro, Sterling South Bank, Triad Stage Theater and National Conference for Community and Justice.

In 2007, she was presented the Commanders Cross of the Order of Merit by the President of Poland and most recently, with the Ellis Island Medal of Honor.

Ambassador Vos is married to Louis DeJoy and has 14 year old twins.

## Biographies Of NCFRW Winter Board Meeting Speakers



### **SUE EVERHART ~ Chairman, Georgia Republican Party**

Sue Everhart was elected the first woman chairman of the Georgia Republican Party in 2007. Prior to being elected chairman, she was the first vice chairman of the party, as well as the party's 6th District Chairman. In June, Everhart was appointed to the Republican National Committee's Ethics Committee.

In addition, she serves on the RNC Rules Committee and is a member of the RNC Chairman's Kitchen Cabinet. Everhart was named the Georgia Republican Party's Volunteer of the Year in 2000 and received its Pioneer Award in 2005 for her long and continued service to the Party. She was selected in 2007 as one of the 100 Most Influential Georgians. A former banker, she currently serves on the Advisory Board for the Cobb County Symphony and is a member of the Cultural Arts Board of Cobb County. She is the past chairman of the Cobb Board of Elections and former board member of the Cobb County Convention and Visitors Bureau. Everhart was born in North Carolina and still has family here.



### **PATRICK 'PAT' MCCRORY ~ Former Mayor of Charlotte, NC**

Former Mayor Pat McCrory, the longest serving Mayor in the history of Charlotte, North Carolina, served as president of the Republican Mayors and Local Officials (RMLLO) organization from 1995-2009 and was the Founding Chair for the North Carolina Metropolitan Coalition, a group of the state's 25 large-city mayors. Mayor McCrory began his political career in Charlotte in 1989 when he was elected as an At-Large City Council representative in his first run for an elected office. He was reelected in both 1991 and 1993, serving as Mayor Pro Tem in 1993 until first elected Mayor in 1995.

Mayor McCrory has distinguished himself as a leader in public safety, economic development, housing and transportation. He has been recognized nationally for his leadership in developing Charlotte's 25-year transportation and land use plan. McCrory was born in [Ohio](#) but grew up in [Jamestown, North Carolina](#), and attended [Ragsdale High School](#), where he served as [Student Body President](#). McCrory graduated from [Catawba College](#) in 1978 with a B.A. in political science and education. After graduation, McCrory worked with [Duke Energy Corporation](#) in various management positions. McCrory represented NC well in 2008 as our Governor candidate – not a good year for Republicans.





### **NC SENATOR RICHARD BURR United States Senator from North Carolina**

On January 4, 2005, Richard Burr was sworn-in to serve North Carolina in the United States Senate. Elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1994, Richard quickly established himself as a passionate legislator.

As Senator, Richard continues to focus on job growth across North Carolina by working to ensure a robust economic environment and strong public schools. He is dedicated to finding common-sense solutions to increase access to affordable, quality health care for all North Carolina families. He is a vocal advocate for our men and women in the military and their families, and for the growing population of veterans across North Carolina.

In the Senate, Richard serves as Ranking Member of the Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee where he works to improve the quality of health care and service our nation's veterans receive. Burr also sits on the Senate Armed Services Committee; the Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee; the Energy and Natural Resources Committee; and the Intelligence Committee.

The son of a minister, Richard and his family moved to Winston-Salem, North Carolina when he was a young child. After graduating from Wake Forest University, he began his career far from the halls of Congress by spending seventeen years in business with Carswell Distributing, a wholesale commercial products company. He currently serves as a Board Member of Brenner Children's Hospital. Richard and his wife, Brooke, have two sons.



### **SHERIFF BJ BARNES Guilford County, North Carolina Sheriff**

The Guilford County Sheriff's Office has approximately 560 employees. The Sheriff is responsible for 652 square miles and over 465,000 citizens. The Guilford County Sheriff's Office has experienced a 46% reduction in crime under Sheriff Barnes. He continues to be elected with over 60% of the vote in a predominately democrat county.

Unlike any other county in North Carolina, the Sheriff's Office is responsible for two jails, a county prison farm and two court systems in two metro areas. Under Sheriff Barnes, the Guilford County Sheriff's Office has won many awards including The Best Large Office in the State for two years. Sheriff Barnes was recently nominated for Sheriff of the Year, an award given by the National Sheriff's Association. The Guilford County Sheriff's Office and Sheriff Barnes have also been positively featured on CNN, The Today Show, Larry King, Paul Harvey, Rush Limbaugh Show and in USA Weekend.

Sheriff Barnes has over thirty-six (36) years of law enforcement experience, fifteen (15) as Sheriff of Guilford County. Sheriff Barnes served as a Bank Officer and Senior Investigator for what is now Bank of America. He served as Special Assistant to the Director of the Office of Motor Vehicles, Driver's License Section and as Law Enforcement Liaison for the State of North Carolina on the North Carolina Drug Cabinet.

Sheriff Barnes served as a non-Commissioned Officer in the United States Marine Corps and wrote the Law Enforcement Section of the North Carolina Drug Plan, directed and produced the Video "Dealing with Substance Abuse" used across the state by law enforcement and substance abuse programs, wrote numerous brochures and pamphlets for educational use, wrote the Audio Tape Free From Fear and has his own Television Show, "Guilford Sheriff 911" – Public Access.

Sheriff Barnes has assisted with several Campaign workshops for new candidates beginning in 1994 when several Republican Sheriffs were elected statewide and has worked in Guilford County with GGRWC, the County Party, the Martin and Coble campaigns as well as assisting and advising many new candidates over the years.

Sheriff Barnes is married to Dena Barnes and they have two daughters, two granddaughters and four grandsons. Sheriff Barnes is a resident of Summerfield.



**REP. JULIA C. Howard State Representative** is a [Republican](#) member of the [North Carolina General Assembly](#) representing the state's seventy-ninth House district, including constituents in [Davidson](#), [Davie](#) and [Iredell](#) counties.

A realtor from [Mocksville, North Carolina](#), Howard is currently (2003-2004 session) serving in her eighth term in the state House. She earned her degree from Salem College in two years.

Rep. Julia Howard is the current Chairwoman of the Committee to Elect Republican Women.



**REP. PEARL BURRIS-FLOYD State Representative** is a proud Republican woman and serves in the North Carolina General Assembly as a member of the House of Representatives. Rep. Burris-Floyd is the first African American Woman elected to serve in the NC House. Her immediate past public service as a Gaston County Commissioner from the Dallas Township 2001-2008, and Vice-Chair 2006-2008 launched her career as a servant leader on which she has served two terms. She currently has the privilege serving in the NC House of Representatives, representing both Cleveland and Gaston Counties in District 110.

Pearl is a native North Carolinian and a product of Gaston County's public schools. Pearl graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Medicine Cytology School and is an Internationally Recognized Cancer Detection Specialist.
